SELECTIVE ADMISSION

The ADED Program has a selective admissions policy. Students should contact the Vacca Office of Student Services (304 White Hall) early in their first year to receive details of the selective admissions process and to discuss the steps needed to be an eligible candidate for the program. To enter a program, candidates need:

1. to maintain a strong GPA (both total as well as content);
2. to obtain reference letters;
3. to complete an essay;
4. to interview with faculty members; and
5. achieve a sufficient score on the Praxis I test.

These steps are assessed at the time of applying for advanced standing. Be sure to stay in touch with a program counselor in the Vacca Office of Student Services (in 304 White Hall) regarding your timeline.
